The Doctoral School *Practices and representation of Female Power*, organised by the research projects "eReginae - Writing and Queens: Queenly Chanceries as Power Instruments" and "Female Power and Patronage: Portugal, France, Burgundy, 13th-early 16th centuries", will:

- Provide comprehensive, high-level training on the practices and representations of female power in medieval Europe;
- Introduce students to the practice of electronic editing of medieval texts based on queenly documentation;
- Give students the opportunity to present their work to peers and experts in the field, and discuss it with them;
- Introduce students to the resources available at the Portuguese National Archives.

The students will have 30 hours of on-site work (plus 40 hours of preparatory work), certifiable for 2,5 ECTS credits.

The Doctoral School will have two types of sessions each day:

The morning sessions will be composed of lectures from specialists such as: Ana Maria S. A. Rodrigues, Murielle Gaude-Ferragu, Manuela Santos Silva, Miriam Shadis, Susana Tavares Pedro, Maria do Rosário Morujão, Lledó Ruiz Domingo, Maria Barreto Dávila.

The afternoon sessions will be reserved to the presentation and discussion of the work of the selected PhD students.
